Fish Tank – Free to a good home.

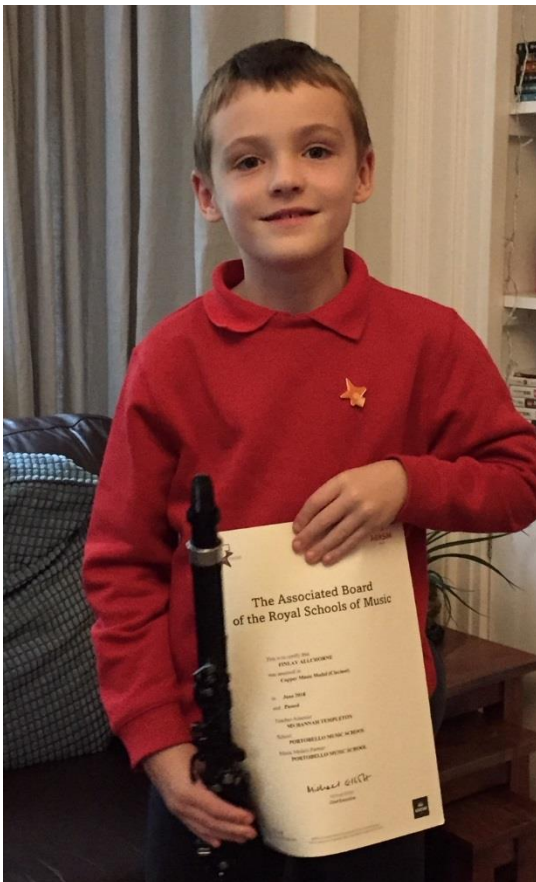
